

# Mance Foundation Partners with Local School to Help Lead the Future

When organizations form a partnership with educators and community leaders, ideas are actualized, exciting endeavors are pursued, and many in the community reap benefits. We are proud to share that our **Leadership Mentoring Program** curriculum for high school students will be piloted at Gwynn Park High School in Brandywine, MD beginning with the 2013-2014 school year. The program generated excitement when the proposal was initially shared and subsequently presented to the Gwynn Park HS leadership team this past November.

**Roderick O. Mance** -- Ryan's brother and the artist that designed the Mance Foundation logo and tag line -- developed the Leadership Mentoring Program. Roderick will serve as the Program Director in a volunteer capacity.

The program is designed to provide a powerful curriculum that young African American males are often not privy to until they have lagged behind their peers. The program will provide ongoing academic and career guidance to high school African American males, equipping participants with practical knowledge of leadership principles essential to progress through college and ultimately achieve the American dream...a better and richer and fuller life.

Anticipating success of the pilot at Gwynn Park HS --which will be facilitated by volunteer male mentor involvement and the continuing support of loyal donors sponsors -- the program will be expanded to our other two current partnership high schools – Laurel High School and Mayo High School for Math, Science and Technology.
